We Celebrate Connection & Transformation

Communion (in front of the altar), Anointing for Healing (against the north west wall), and Personal Intercessory Prayer (in the chapel) are offered simultaneously at this time.

We celebrate an open Communion. When you come forward, a volunteer will dip the wafer in the juice, place it in your mouth and offer you a brief blessing. We serve only non-alcoholic wine and the wafers are 100% wheat. We celebrate a variety of understandings about communion and so we believe the bread and juice are transformed in community to be spiritual nourishment for all people. As another way of respecting our Bedrock Belief that there are many paths to God, if you would like a non-Christ centered blessing, simply approach the volunteer with your arms crossed over your chest.

Anointing for Healing A volunteer will place oil on your forehead and offer a simple blessing such as "Be anointed for healing and to be a healer in the name of God our Creator, Jesus our Friend and the Holy Spirit."

Personal Intercessory Prayer A Prayer Partner volunteer will pray with you after you share a brief description of your concern/celebration.

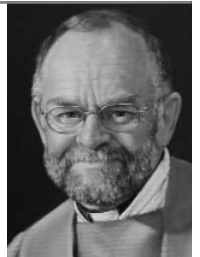

DID YOU KNOW that MCC Toronto embraces a set of core values and bedrock beliefs that shape what we do - that means we live our doctrine in our daily life as a spiritual community. HOW TO MAKE PALM CROSSES

1. Take a palm that is about 2 feet long and 1/2" wide (if it tapers at the top, this is good!)
2. Hold the palm upright, so the tapered end points toward the ceiling. Then bend the top end down and toward you so that the bend is about 5 or 6 inches from the bottom of the palm.
3. About a third of the way from the bend you just made, twist the section you've pulled down to the right, forming a right angle.
4. About an inch or inch and a half away from the "stem" of the cross, bend this arm of the palm back behind the palm so that it is now facing to your left. Make the bend at a good length to form the right arm of the Cross.
5. Folding that same section at a point that equals the length on the right side, bend it on the left side and bring the end forward over what is now the front of the cross.
6. From the very center of the Cross, fold that arm up and to the upper right (in a "northeast" direction) so that it can wrap around where the upright post of the Cross and the right arm intersect.
7. Fold this down and to the left behind the Cross, and then fold it toward the right so that it is parallel and under the transverse arms of the Cross.
8. Bring it up behind the Cross again, this time folding it up toward the "northwest" direction.
9. Tuck the tapered end into the transverse section you made in step.
10. Turn the Cross over; this side will be the front. Trim the tapered end if necessary.

Instructions for self-administered Communion:

- ♦ Please cleanse your hands with a drop of sanitary liquid.
- ♦ Remove the linen
- ♦ (If you wish) lightly dip host in de-alcoholized wine.
- ♦ Consume host.
- ♦ silent blessing example:
"Know that God loves you unconditionally and is ever-present with you. Amen."
- ♦ If you are waiting, please maintain an atmosphere of calm reflection as others receive.
- ♦ Replace the linen

[Note: Hosts have been consecrated and are holy. If dropped, please pick-up and consume the wafer; or set it aside on the plate provided, for Altar Guild attention.]

The Amazing Race

"So many changes, so many challenges. MCC Toronto celebrated together on the day of President Barack Obama's inauguration, joining millions of hopeful masses around the world. 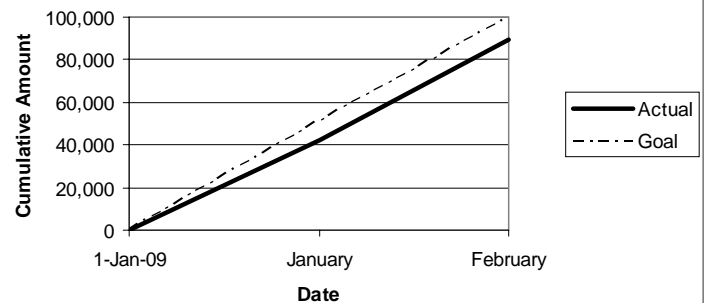

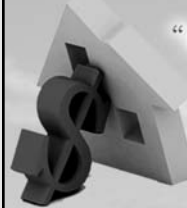

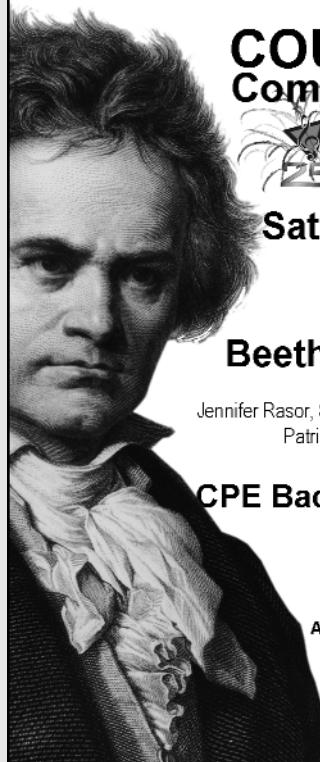
