I raised the elements and consecrated them prior to serving Communion at Roy Thomson Hall on Christmas Eve. Only the audience members seated in the Mezzanine section were my witnesses, as I was simply mirroring what Rev. Brent Hawkes, other clergy, and deacons were doing behind the Altar on stage. Yet I would have never had this transformative experience if the worship co-ordinators hadn't grabbed me the moment I arrived for my scheduled greeter role. They were short on servers and believed I could just step into something I'd

never done before. That's the beauty and joy for me of volunteering at MCC Toronto. From one-time projects in the early years (collating materials for a sign-language class or providing child care to Easter palm-cross makers) to a decade of easy involvement in the social aspects of the community (welcoming newcomers, planning dances and trips, decorating the Sanctuary), I was eager to contribute, assured I'd found a place where I belonged.

I'd already taken my leap of faith by attending that first Christmas Eve service in 1990, but it was only after others placed their faith in me that I discovered an inner joy that's grown stronger with every passing year as I continue to Anoint and serve Communion. I hope that you, too, will seek similar opportunities to grow in faith and service, especially as we celebrate Anniversary Sunday.

44 Years of MCC Toronto

- 1973 A petition is sent to Rev. Troy Perry in Los Angeles requesting a Metropolitan Community Church in Toronto.
- 1974 Rev. Bob Wolfe confronts Toronto City Council about the problem of homophobia in the city's newspapers and the challenges facing LGBTQ youth.
- 1975 MCC Toronto rents a home on Granby St. and sets up a counselling centre, The Gay Community Services.
- 1977 Rev. Brent Hawkes becomes Senior Pastor of MCC Toronto.
- 1978 MCC congregations hold services across Canada concurrent with and in opposition to anti-gay rallies that featured Anita Bryant.
- 1981 Toronto police raid 4 gay bathhouses and arrest over 300 men. Rev. Brent Hawkes begins a 25 day hunger strike on the steps of the Ontario Legislature calling for an inquiry.
- 1981 The Ontario Legislature considers a motion to amend the Ontario Human Rights Code to include sexual orientation as a protected category. When the debate was turning against LGBTQ rights, Rev. Hawkes led an act of civil disobedience, disrupting the legislature.
- 1986 Sexual orientation receives protection under the Ontario Human Rights Code. MCC Toronto obtains 25 signatures from religious leaders to support the amendment.
- 1990 MCC Toronto expands its AIDSCARE program to more than 100 individuals in homes served by 140 volunteers.
- 1991 MCC Toronto outgrows our Gerrard St. church and purchases our current church at 115 Simpson Ave.
- 1994 MCC Toronto begins a partnership with the TDSB to sponsor the Triangle Program, a safe learning space for LGBTQ youth.
- 1996 MCC Toronto intervenes in the case of Egan vs. Canada, seeking equality of same-sex rights under the Old Age Security Act.

| Rev Hawkes is awarded a Doctorate of Ministry from Trinity College at the University of Toronto. | |
| Rev. Troy Perry (founder of MCC) and Phillip De Blicek are legally married at MCC Toronto. | 2003 |
| MCC Toronto develops a revolutionary adult spiritual education program that expands to MCC worldwide. | 2005 |
| Rev. Dr. Brent Hawkes is appointed to the Order of Canada by Governor General, The Right Honourable Michaëlle Jean. | 2007 |
| MCC Toronto begins broadcasting on the internet, bringing our message of hope, love and acceptance to 147 countries. | 2008 |
| Renovations begin for the Triangle Program, improving the educational experience for LGBTQ youth. | 2010 |
| With support from Diane Leah and The Choir of MCC Toronto, Rev. Dr. Brent Hawkes, C.M., officiates at the state funeral for Jack Layton. | 2011 |
| Brent is named Grand Marshall of the World Pride Parade. | 2014 |
| MCC Toronto develops programs and procedures to adapt to the changing Care needs of the community. | 2016 |
| Rev. Deana Dudley is appointed as our first Assistant Pastor. | 2017 |

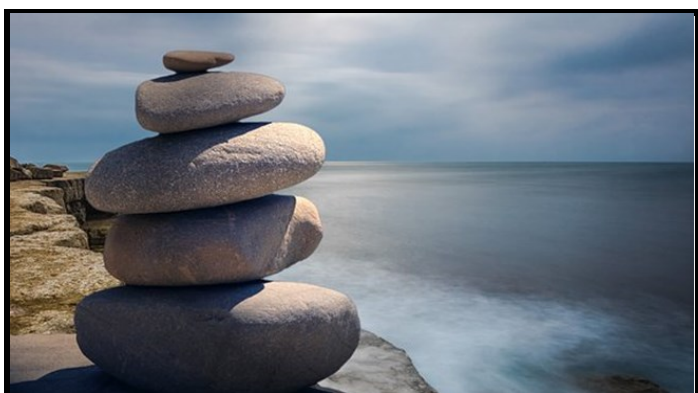
