It's been of a bit of a trying year, hasn't it? I know that many of us have had some challenges, some losses, some fears. As Rev. Jeff is fond of saying, there are times when "it's OK not to be OK".

But it's also OK to look towards the future with a sense of hope and confidence. In times like this, I'm reminded of a beautiful poem by the German pastor and theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer, "Von guten Mächten wunderbar geborgen," loosly translated as "By gracious powers wonderfully surrounded." Bonhoeffer wrote this poem in late December of 1944, as a sort of year-end/New Year's greeting to his friends and family. In December of 1944, Bonhoeffer was in concentration camp, and was awaiting certain execution for his participation in armed resistance to the Nazi regime. He knew it was the last New Year he would see in this life. Talking about having a bad year!

And yet, what Bonhoeffer wrote was full of hope and comfort and confidence in a loving God.

"Surrounded by such true and gentle powers so wondrously consoled and without fear thus I will spend with you these final hours and then together enter a new year

By gentle powers lovingly surrounded, With patience will endure, let come with may God is with us at night and in the morning and certainly on every future day"

Bonhoeffer's poem has been set to music and has been become a much-loved German hymn especially at this time of year, as we contemplate a somewhat uncertain future.

I'll be honest, like many of you, I had a tough year with a lot of losses. I am acutely aware of fears about the future. And yet I often play this hymn, over and over on a loop when I am working in my office. (You can listen to it **HERE**, in German with helpful English subtitles.) I find peace in it, as well as great hope and courage.

As we "together enter a new year" I hope you will find peace and hope and courage, too, because we are indeed "by gentle powers lovingly surrounded... come what may."




