I love Family Day weekend. Partly, it's because it's February – the middle of winter, with some of the worst weather, and I think we really just NEED a holiday about now.

But also, I celebrate families of all kinds. I've been known to say that families (especially mine) are sometimes complicated. Case in point: When Janet and I got married, her father literally would not speak to her for nearly five years, because he thought equal marriage was "a travesty." For five years, I prayed daily that he would understand and appreciate the love that Janet and I share.

And Lo and Behold, eventually he came around. He acknowledged that, while I was not the son-in-law he expected, I "would do." He was a fiercely independent, extremely introverted man. At 94, he was still living independently in his own home, and resisted all of Janet's attempt to "help" with anything.

But in these last few months, time and age caught up with him, and he needed that help. Janet and I were privileged to care for him in his last days, in his own home. And near the end, he finally said to Janet, "She really is a part of our family." And when I would say "I love you," he would say "I love you too." He passed away on February 1, in his own bed, on his own terms. And I am reminded once again, that LOVE always bats last.

Originally from Halifax, Nova Scotia, Troy Adams has been performing in various theatres across Canada for the last 33 years. Toronto audiences may have seen him singing down in the Distillery District as part of Soulpepper's concert series, or in Musical Stage Co.'s production of *Next to Normal*.

A few other recent productions include Soulpepper's production of *Angels in America*, Parts 1 and 2 (Belize); *Dreamgirls* at Theatre Aquarius / The Grand Theatre (Jimmy Early); *Othello* at Shakespeare by the Sea (Othello); *Wanderlust* at the Stratford Festival (The Balladeer); *Shrek: The Musical* at Neptune Theatre / The Grand Theatre (Donkey); *The Adventures of a Black Girl in Search of God* at the Harbourfront Centre / Centaur Theatre / NAC (Ancestor); and *Cinderella* at the Neptune Theatre (Cinderella's father).

I wanted to submit something that spoke to me artistically and reflected what my soul needed to express regarding what was happening at that time with both the global race protests and the pandemic. Being of mixed heritage (Black Loyalist, Mi'kmaq and Scottish), I decided that *Make Them Hear You* was the perfect choice.

I also wanted to express that this was not our first uprising. Rather, I think the excerpt from Martin Luther King's speech in 1966 reflects exactly what we are still demanding today. The photos of Frederick Douglass and the Black Lives Matter protesters serve to further highlight the many times we have had to stand up to inequality. Until equality happens, I say *Make Them Hear You*.
