Jason is a Dora nominated music director who has worked on many musical theatre productions and concerts in Toronto from the Queen musical *We Will Rock You*, to conducting the recent Toronto production of *Come From Awa*y, to accompanying acclaimed singer Colm Wilkinson on a tour to Japan. In October 2019, Jason took on the role of Music Director at MCC Toronto. As well as music directing, Jason also



composes choral music that has been performed across Canada by such acclaimed choirs as the Elmer Iseler Singers, and Vancouver Chamber Choir, and The Choir of MCC Toronto. Since 2020, Jason has also served as the musician-in-residence at Holy Blossom Temple.



G Jeannie Wyse, Associate Music Director/Conductor

Jeannie is the Head of the Vocal department at the Randolph College for the Performing Arts and has been Associate Music Director at MCC Toronto since 2001. She appeared as the Vocal Coach for CBC's Over The Rainbow and is in demand as a Vocal Teacher, Conductor and Musical Director.

Jeannie has toured North America with Riverdance and the Elmer Iseler Singers and has worked with the Canadian Children's Opera Chorus and Toronto Mendelssohn Youth Choir. Shows include: *Priscilla*, *Holiday Inn*, *The Drowsy Chaperone*, *Anything Goes*, *Chicago*, *Wizard of Oz*, *Mary Poppins*, *Jersey Boys*, *The Sound of Music*, *Seussical*, *Nine*, *Kiss Me Kate*, *The Full Monty*, *Hair*, *Wonderful Town*, and *Into The Woods*. She has a private studio teaching Musical Theatre, Pop and Classical voice and is also active as a Clinician and Adjudicator.

🇄 Mark Cassius

Mark is a concert and musical theatre artist. He is a graduate of Sheridan College's Music Theatre Program and is presently working on a Masters degree in Music Composition at York University.

He is highly recognized for his work as a member of the world-renowned acapella group, The Nylons (1997– 2005). On Broadway, he has performed in *Ragtime*, *Shenandoah* (1989) and *Jesus Christ Superstar* (2012).



Other musical theatre credits include *Cats* (Canadian Premier), *The Music of Andrew Lloyd Webber In Concert, Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat* (with Donny Osmond), *Miss Saigon, Showboat*, and *The Musical of Musicals (The Musical!)* (Broadway World "Best Actor" nominee).

He has been featured at the Shaw Festival, and at the Stratford Festival won critical acclaim in the role of "Mr. Magix" in *My One and Only* (2008). He is a performance instructor at the Randolph College for the Performing Arts and is completely dedicated to the nurturing of the artist. Julie is, quite simply, a woman with a beautiful voice. She sings everything and anything that catches her ear: jazz standards, rhythm and blues, Brazilian sambas, African chanting – in a world full of music, it's a banquet of sound just too delicious to pass up! She has played with George Koller, Ottawa's Chelsea Bridge, Kevin Barrett and her bands Sutra and The Parley at

many popular jazz venues including the Montreal Bistro, Top of the Senator, the Rex, Hugh's Room, Ottawa's National Arts Centre, Toronto's own Statler's and Canadian and European festivals.

Julie's CDs include *Singing Naked* (duets with bassist George Koller), *Live at Statler's* (with guitarist Kevin Barrett), the soundtrack for *Pivoting Echoes* (debuted with one of Canada's premier dance companies, the Decidedly Jazz Danceworks) and *Seriously Happy* with the Royal Jelly Orchestra and she is a featured artist on The Choir's second CD, *Connected: Songs for the Heart*, which is available on iTunes.
