2022 Fundraising Highlights | The Best is Yet to Come!

Dear MCC Toronto members and congregants,

While an audit of our 2022 financial results won't begin until next month for a formal presentation at our Annual Church Business Meeting (ACBM) in June, I wanted to share some preliminary fundraising highlights from the fiscal year 2022.

- In April, we publicly launched **ELEVATION MCC Toronto Campaign** with the announcement that we had raised \$4.75 million toward our \$5 million goal. Since then, I am delighted to report that we have raised **\$5.1 million**. Funds raised through the **ELEVATION** Campaign have supported the 5,000 net square foot renovations of public spaces outside our Sanctuary, the hiring of Bennett "BJ" Jensen as our inaugural Human Rights Director and new human rights programming as well as technology enhancements in our Sanctuary and Social Hall. Of the funds raised, over 80% have come from donors outside our Church family who chose to support us because they believed in our human rights work.
- In July, we announced that the Congregational Campaign in support of ELEVATION
 had raised \$160,000, which was \$10,000 over the fundraising goal. Since that time, a
 further \$5,000 has been raised. Funds from the Congregational Campaign will support
 Sanctuary improvements (wall & ceiling repairs, painting, new fans) slated for this
 summer.
- Our Year-End Appeal, "The Best is Yet to Come," raised a remarkable \$116,529! This Campaign, along with the Congregational Campaign, marked the first time that MCC Toronto rolled out two major fundraising campaigns in the same calendar year.
 Together, these Campaigns raised a truly astonishing \$280,000! We are incredibly grateful for the many ways our members, congregants and broader community step

forward in support of our work.

- This past year, MCC Toronto raised a record-setting \$93,000 in major gifts to support our LGBTQ+ Refugee Programs. Even more incredible was the fact that a greater number of these significant gifts came from outside funders who recognize the critical importance of providing services, support and hope to the hundreds of LGBTQ+ Refugees that we serve each year. Many thanks to the following donors for their major gift support of our LGBTQ+ Refugee Programs in 2022: Perrinham Foundation, The Catherine & Maxell Meighen Foundation, Tippet Foundation, Chris Brillinger, Scott McCain & Leslie McLean, The Paul Butler and Chris Black Foundation at Toronto Foundation, and Human Rights Internet.
- This past year, we also secured the first of a three-year commitment of \$35,000 per year from TD Bank Financial Group in support of The Triangle Program, Canada's first LGBTQ+ High School, which has been housed at MCC Toronto since 1995. TD's support, along with long-time program funder RBC Foundation, enables MCC Toronto to continue to host The Triangle Program free of charge. We are grateful to both banks for their enabling support.

Beyond these great fundraising successes, I am happy to report that we are in good financial shape heading into the 2023 calendar year. I look forward to sharing the full results of our financial picture once a formal audit is completed this spring. I would like to extend thanks to John R. Farrell, MCC Toronto's Director of Development & Communication, for his continued fundraising leadership and to our hardworking finance team. And most importantly, I would like to extend my heartfelt thanks to you – our members, congregants and donors – whom every day give us the confidence to declare that the best is yet to come!

Recognizing Black History Month



February marks the beginning of Black History Month. While we reflect on and celebrate the legacy of Black lives, MCC Toronto would challenge you to lift up, celebrate, listen to, and learn from those in our community who are living Black *queer* lives, specifically. Our friends at **Queer Events** (a community resource and connection tool) agree: "the histories and struggles of queer Black communities and contributions are frequently erased and missing from mainstream narratives. Deemed unworthy of saving or even recognized by society, they often remain buried in files and boxes in the homes of the individuals who participated in those activities or faded out of memory. This loss of memory threatens to erase us from the history of the Queer community, and it is vitally important that this space is reclaimed and held."

To the Black community members: we wish you a joyful time of community and celebration of all your intersecting identities. If you are a white ally of the Black community, we urge you not to be a passive observer this Black History Month. Read about and follow the work of notable Black Canadians, support Black-owned businesses in the GTA, attend programs, classes, & exhibits, show up to community events, engage with queer Black creators, take in Black art, and — just as we are challenging ourselves to do at MCC Toronto in 2023 — engage in active self-learning on becoming anti-racist.

Our vibrant queer community is blessed with the super-power of support that allows us to lift up one another in a magical way. This February, we invite you to use that gift to uplift those with multi-identities and all of their beautiful intersections. Happy Black History Month!


