Julie Birungi is a Canadian-Ugandan gospel singer known in Uganda and across East Africa for her songs like Nkulembera, Lwana Nabo, Ekikunyumira and Bamuyita Yesu.

Julie received the Best Female Gospel Song award for her song Saba in 2014 and the Best Religious Song award for List Ya Mukama in 2015. She was nominated for Best Religious Song for Kijja Kugwa in 2016 at the third, fourth and fifth HiPipo Music Awards, respectively. She also won the Song of the Year award at the Olive Gospel Music Awards in 2012, the Female Artist of the Year award at the VIGA Awards in 2016, and the Diva Collabo Award for Yani, a collaboration with Iryn Namubiru, at the 2011 Diva Awards.



Julie currently lives happily with her wife and their seven children in Hamilton, Ontario, and continues to worship the Lord with songs of praise at every opportunity she gets. She also founded an organization (Juleans Blessing Hands) to help single mothers, including LGBTQ+ moms, with vulnerable children back in her home country because she understands what it's like to live under those circumstances. Beau Dixon is a self-taught, award-winning songwriter, musician, actor, playwright, music director, sound designer, producer and artistic director for Firebrand Theatre. As a songwriter and musician, Beau has shared the stage with Serena Ryder, Rufus Wainwright, Feist, Ron Sexsmith, Jeff Healey, Jully Black and countless others. He has toured extensively throughout Canada, the U.S. and Europe and has three albums under his name, available on iTunes, Bandcamp and other streaming platforms.

As an actor, he has performed on many reputable theatre stages throughout Canada. *NOW Magazine* and the *Toronto Star* have listed him among Toronto's top ten theatre actors, multiple years in a row. Beau is currently performing in Porchside Songs with Musical Stage, as well as music-directing a show he created for Stratford Festival entitled *FREEDOM 2.0: Black Music That Changed America*.
