I think the completion of renovations to our public spaces will mean a lot for MCC Toronto's future. I know it is meaningful to Michael McCain and Margaret "Margi" McCain whose leadership and support will be celebrated with the soon-to-be naming of the McCain Family Social Hall. I know it is meaningful to donors to **ELEVATION – MCC Toronto Campaign** donors who funded the renovations in anticipation of the future human rights work and programming that will soon take up the space. Credit is owed to so many people for getting us to this place. None more than our dear friend and fearless Facilities Manager Mark Asselin, who Rev. Deana celebrated as part of Sunday's dedication.

Every flourish – from colour selection to lighting; every detail – from expanding the size of the vestibule to integrate two formerly obstructive posts to moving the location of our Information Desk; every architectural delight – from the unveiling of the new clerestory windows to the soon to be installed curved wooden feature wall; all came about through Mark. When I arrived at MCC Toronto to lead the **ELEVATION Campaign**, the how's and way's of realizing the renovation ambitions to be achieved through the Campaign were totally uncertain. Managing and overseeing a complex construction project required a high level of professionalism and construction proficiency that seemed – at the time - terribly out of reach. The day Mark arrived at MCC Toronto in November 2018, all uncertainty was silenced. Here was a man who would see us – and steer us – through.

Which he did. With love. With creativity. With 150% dedication.

Bucking convention – which he has proudly done his entire life - Mark has asked us to host a living funeral for him. Which we are.


