Last Sunday, the church entered the liturgical season of Lent. Lent is a 40-day period of reflection, prayer, and sometimes fasting that takes place before Easter. Lent began on Ash Wednesday, which is always six weeks before Easter, which falls on April 9 this year. During these six weeks, we prepare our hearts, minds and bodies through self-examination,

penance, and renewed devotion to God as we anticipate the joyous celebration of Easter morning.

Many people give something up, but that's only one aspect of the season. Traditionally, Lent has three parts: fasting, prayer, and almsgiving. If prayer doesn't make sense to you, then make a commitment to daily meditation or journaling – whatever helps you to examine your life. If you have the means, pick a charity to donate to throughout the season. It's also possible to combine Lenten practices, for example, giving up your daily Starbucks and donating the savings to help those in need.

One important thing to remember is that Lent begins and ends with a joyous celebration! We began Lent at MCC Toronto with a fabulous pancake feast in our newly renovated Social Hall, and we will end it with a jubilant celebration of Easter and resurrection. That's one of the reasons that we're calling our Lenten sermon series "Faith in the Future" because here at MCC Toronto we have so much to look forward to.
