

We Want to Hear From You | Pride Celebration Service

As the footprint of the Village shrinks each year due to redevelopment, the search for a space for MCC Toronto's Pride Celebration Service has become increasingly difficult. After an exhaustive search for this year, and with no outdoor options being available, we are down to two possible location options – and we want to hear what you think!

Option 1: Church on Church at Mattamy Athletic Centre, Varsity Court

Part of the redesigned Maple Leaf Gardens, the Varsity Court at the Mattamy Athletic Centre (part of the Toronto Metropolitan University) is a relatively new and very adaptable space with good acoustics. Should MCC Toronto pursue this option, the court floor would be covered, and the bleachers would be off to the side to accommodate a raised platform for the Pride Celebration Service and 700 chairs for seating. If this is the option we go with, we would need to raise \$15,000 to cover overall Celebration Service expenses.

Option 2: Church on Church at Church

While expected rain (that didn't materialize...) forced a move of last year's Pride Celebration Service back to our home church, we heard from many congregants that they appreciated the opportunity to celebrate Pride in our beloved Sanctuary.


