About Us

Celebrating its golden 50th Anniversary in 2023, MCC Toronto was established in 1973 as part of the Universal Fellowship of Metropolitan Community Churches – a denomination and global LGBTQ+ Christian movement. Throughout its history, MCC Toronto has been a place of worship – and a place of action. Our weekly Worship Services are attended by over 600 congregants both in–person and online. We count a broader congregant community of over 2,000 members drawn from many different religious backgrounds and beliefs, gender identities, gender expressions, sexual orientations, racial and cultural backgrounds, countries of origin, socioeconomic realities, and abilities. We are a proud vibrant, inclusive, and progressive faith community – at MCC Toronto everyone matters and everyone belongs.

Rooted in the 2SLGBTQ+ community, MCC Toronto has long been at the centre of community activism. We have been home to the Triangle Program, Canada's first 2SLGBTQ+ High School since 1995. We were national leaders in the fight for same sex marriage. Our LGBTQ+ Refugee Programs have served over 8,000 refugees and through our status as the exclusive Sponsorship Agreement Holder for LGBTQ+ refugees to Canada, we have brought 75 refugees to safety in Canada since 2007. In 2022, MCC Toronto announced that it had raised a record-setting \$5 million through a major gift campaign to help support an elevation of our human rights work through expanded programming, new partnerships, and an emphasis on creating impact and change.

MCC Toronto's vision is to be a growing, inclusive, spiritual community that creates a just, kind and loving world for all. We work every day to live our core values of Advocacy, Diversity and Spirituality.

6 Jason Jestadt, Music Director

Jason is a Dora nominated music director who has worked on many musical theatre productions and concerts in Toronto, from the Queen musical We Will Rock You, to conducting the Toronto production of Come From Away, to accompanying acclaimed singer Colm Wilkinson on a tour to Japan. In October 2019, Jason took on the role of Music Director at MCC Toronto.



As well as music directing, Jason also composes choral music that has been performed across Canada by such acclaimed choirs as the Elmer Iseler Singers, and Vancouver Chamber Choir, and The Choir of MCC Toronto. Since 2020, Jason has also served as musician-in-residence at Holy Blossom Temple.



Alana Bridgewater

Alana is a singer/songwriter who discovered her love of performing at a very early age. Alana is best known for her performance as Killer Queen in the Mirvish production of We Will Rock You. She was also featured in Hannibal (NBC) as Denise, the feisty orderly.

Her most recent credits include Spoon River (Soulpepper); Shrek: The Musical (The Grand Theatre, London); Hairspray (Charlottetown



She has sung backup vocals for Carvin Winans and Johnny Reid and The Arkells, was a featured performer on the MCC Toronto Choir's CD "Connected: Songs for the Heart," and has recorded two solo albums, "A Beautiful Christmas" and "Horizon."

Gavin Hope is a three-time Juno Award nominee, both as a solo vocalist and as a member of the iconic Canadian a cappella group The Nylons. He has sung with Natalie Cole, Deborah Cox, James Brown, and Aretha Franklin, among others.

Gavin has been a featured vocalist with Jeans 'n
Classics for more than a decade, performing the
music of Earth, Wind and Fire, Michael Jackson,
Prince, Stevie Wonder, and various Broadway hits on the symphonic stage.



His musical theatre highlights include The Lion King (Simba) and RENT (Collins).

From the studio to the stage, Gavin just loves to perform, and when he's not on the road, he loves to share his gifts with fans in his current hometown of Toronto.



Messy Margaret

Messy Margaret is Toronto's premiere dragtress and comedy queen. She has appeared on stage and on screen, but, most importantly, she has become one of TikTok's most ignored stars!

She has racked up nearly 90K followers through her silly sketches revolving around the restaurant industry. In 2021, she won Toronto Sketch Comedy's spring sketchcompetition for her original solo sketch,

Shannon McCracken is a singer, actor, voice-over artist and teacher.

Some of Shannon's oratorio work includes Handel's Messiah, Vivaldi's Gloria, and Bach's Magnificat in D Major. As well as frequenting as a guest soloist for choirs and orchestras. Shannon has been featured in cabarets at the Banff Centre, with New Stages, and at the inaugural Women of Musical Theatre Festival in Toronto, and her recital and concert work have taken her across Canada.

The Choir have been featured performers at The Olympic Torch Relay, World Pride Opening Ceremony and the Celebration of Life for Jack Layton, among many others. The Choir has recorded 3 CDs: House of Love (featuring Louise Pitre); The Choir: Connected (with Thom Allison, Alana Bridgewater and Julie Michels) and These Old Walls (featuring Stephanie Martin).
