Worship Services Temporarily Relocate to Social Hall



Dear Members and Congregants,

Beginning this Sunday (**June 23**), MCC Toronto's weekly **11 AM** Worship Services will relocate to the McCain Social Hall while our beloved Sanctuary undergoes renovation.

While we explored temporarily relocating our Services to another venue through the course of the Sanctuary project, we felt that the costs were far too prohibitive. Besides, MCC Toronto is our home – we felt you our members and congregants would feel more connected to us (and us to you) in our own space. This decision, of course, means that we will face a temporary situation where we may simply not have enough seats to

accommodate our growing MCC Toronto family. What a problem to have! Many churches struggle to fill a fraction of their available seats, but MCC Toronto will have the opposite issue for a number of Sundays. *This is not a bad problem to have!*

We can accommodate up to 162 congregants in our new Social Hall set-up (including dedicated seating and spaces for those with walkers and wheelchairs) as well as an additional 30 congregants to watch the Service on the screen in our Rainbow Room. We have set up a state-of-the-art sound and multi-media system that is likely better than the one we had in the Sanctuary. We have relocated our cameras to the Social Hall to see a continuation of our livestreamed services. And we have worked with our worship volunteers to ensure all aspects of our Services are maintained.

We encourage folks who are thinking of attending Service this Sunday to arrive a bit earlier than usual. And if we find ourselves in a situation where we can't accommodate everyone this Sunday, we ask for your patience, understanding and grace. We've worked hard to make this transition as smooth as it can be, and we'll make adjustments in the weeks ahead as needed. 


