# MCC Toronto's LGBTQ+ Refugee Programs

Recently, there has been an increase in the number of refugee claimants seeking assistance through our LGBTQ+ Refugee Programs. In 2022, our intake orientation sessions typically saw an average of 20 participants. However, since January 2023, we have experienced a significant increase, with an average of around 120 participants per session. This trend is reflective of the increasing recognition that MCC Toronto continues to provide a welcoming space for LGBTQ+ asylum seekers. We are proud to see more and more refugee claimants finding solace in our community and benefiting from the inclusive and empowering environment we have cultivated over the years.

Beyond our Peer-to-Peer support for asylum seekers, MCC Toronto's LGBTQ+ Refugee Programs maintain a strong focus on private sponsorship. Through a partnership with the Government of Canada, we continue to sponsor and support LGBTQ+ refugees worldwide, providing a fresh start in Canada. We aim to extend our global impact for 2023 by sponsoring **5 to 10 more refugees**, bringing the total number of refugees MCC Toronto has helped bring to Canada to almost 90. Through our collaboration with Rainbow Railroad, so far in 2023, we have welcomed **11 individuals** from countries where LGBTQ+ persecution remains a pressing issue, including Syria, Iran, Eritrea, Lebanon, Kenya, Uganda, Rwanda, and Nigeria. Our unwavering dedication to building a safer, inclusive world continues as we advocate for the rights and well-being of LGBTQ+ refugees, transforming lives and instilling hope.

As we continue to encourage the formation of more sponsorship teams, we strongly invite our MCC Toronto family to lend a hand in assisting refugees. 
