Rev. Deana Dudley to be officially installed as the first female Senior Pastor in MCC Toronto's 50-year history

Toronto – Friday, January 19– The Metropolitan Community Church of Toronto (MCC Toronto) will add to its already storied legacy by elevating Rev. Deana Dudley (she/they) to the position of Senior Pastor. Rev. Dudley will be installed as MCC Toronto's fifth Senior Pastor and first woman and lesbian on Sunday, January 21 at MCC Toronto's 11 AM Worship Service.

A former Maritime Admiralty lawyer in the United States, Deana sought more meaningful work, became a minister, and moved to Canada in 2001. She holds a B.A. (Hons) from Dominican University, a Juris Doctor from George Washington University, and an M.Div. (Hons) from Wesley Theological Seminary. Rev. Dudley joined MCC Toronto as Assistant Pastor in 2009 and has been Acting Senior Pastor since November 2022.

Established in 1973 as a LGBT2S+-affirming place of worship, MCC Toronto has grown into a vibrant, inclusive and progressive place of worship and a powerhouse human rights organization. Previous Senior Pastors have included founder Rev. Bob Wolfe (1973-1977, he/him), Rev. John Ayres (1977, he/him), Rev. Jeff Rock (2018-2023, he/him) and Rev. Brent Hawkes (1977-2018, he/him) who bears the title Senior Pastor Emeritus.

Building on the foundational work of MCC Toronto's first 50 years, Rev. Dudley has set as her key priorities: engaging 2SLGBTQ+ youth in social justice and human rights work; advocating for the rights of trans and gender-diverse people in the face of increased political antagonism; and exploring new ways for inter-faith collaborations to address religious divisions.
